Football County Champions: The under-18 Boys Football Team have been announced the Buckinghamshire Schools FA Plate Champions! The team played at Arbour Park Stadium, home of Slough Town FC and won their final 2-1. This is the third time in four years that our under-18 Boys Team, which draws on players from our successful Football Academy, has reached the County Cup Final. This year, just to reach the final, our team had to beat two teams seeded above them. Fantastic work boys! I was pleased to hear that after the team celebrated their win, they stayed to cheer on our U16 Girls Team in their closely fought County Cup Final. Our U16 Girls Team narrowly lost their final 3-2, despite being the better team for much of the game.
