Seven months ago, Saba walked out of her GCSE mocks and didn't come back. Her friends don't understand why. Now, on prom night, Saba's finally made contact. But when the friends are finally reunited, Saba is different. And what she's asking of her friends... is it more than they can give?

Danusia Samal is a London-born actress, writer and singer of Kurdish and Polish origin. She spent part of her childhood living in Turkey and Yemen, before returning to the UK aged 10. She trained as an actor at the BRIT School for Performing Arts and the Central School of Speech and Drama. Danusia has worked at numerous prestigious UK theatres, including the Royal Shakespeare Company, The Royal Court, Shakespeare's Globe, Soho Theatre, and Manchester Exchange. Danusia's writing credits include 'Out of Sorts' (Theatre 503); 'Decolonising History' (Tamasha); Busking It' (Shoreditch Town Hall/HighTide) and 'Conditionally' (Soho Theatre/Oxford School of Drama) She also performs regularly as a singer and songwriter. In 2018 she won the Theatre503 International Playwriting Award for 'Out of Sorts', which was later shortlisted for the George Devine Award.
